We recognize that our community members come to us, at least initially, for help to meet needs they are conscious of and that they know that we can assist with: free clothing, personal hygiene items, shoes, blankets, tents, a free cup of coffee and a snack. Our supporters are conscious of the needs they perceive around us as well, and encourage us to engage in addictions support, food provision, and Christian words of hope. These are all good and beautiful things. However, as we get to know each other at Helping Hands, we have been finding a deep underlying need – the need for faithful, consistent, trustworthy friendship.


Hamilton is a city full of service provision of various kinds. The friends here at Helping Hands are better than our staff and volunteers at pointing the way to foodbanks or free prepared food locations. Our mission is to be there with each person; reaching out together, with love and respect, in Jesus' name.



The Bread and Fish

Financial Reports are often either the first thing someone looks at, or the last thing, depending on your perspective. At Helping Hands Street Mission, we want it to definitely be one of the things you look at – because how we are able to keep things running is through your financial support. But understanding the Financial Report (our "Bread and Fish") appropriately is complicated.

God has been very good to Helping Hands over the past year. We had a very successful Fundraising Gala as well as Coldest Night of the Year, both events raising a lot of funds as well as awareness for our ongoing work and the growth of new programs such as Project Hope. We also received ongoing support from monthly donors, each giving at various levels, between \$15-\$500/month, in addition to other financial support from individuals, businesses, foundations, community and church groups.

When you look at our expenses, you see that our programs are run on a tight budget. This is because we are serious about "friendshipbased support". Friendship doesn't cost money. It does cost time. In fact, if we were to even pay simply a living wage to all of our front-line volunteers for the friendship-based support they provide, our expenses would increase by over \$77,000.00. And that doesn't even begin to quantify the ripple effect of friendship-based support into the community, as we reach out together with love and respect in Jesus' name. Together with our support community, we are filling an incredible gap here in our small corner on Barton Street, and with God's help we are seeing the "bread and fish" multiply.

Please keep praying with us for provision. Keep praying for miraculous multiplication of the bread and fish we are given to work with in our Helping Hands Street Mission budget.

PROJECT HOPE


